

NUC Recognises Three More State Varsities for Delta

The Executive Governor of the State, Dr. Ifeanyi Okowa, last Friday received the certificates of recognition for three additional universities for Delta State from the Executive Secretary, National Universities Commission (NUC), Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, mni, MFR, FNAL, the universities are: University of Delta, Agbor; Delta University of Science and Technology, Ozoro and Dennis Osadebe University, Asaba.

This followed the passage of the executive bill for the upgrading of three existing state institutions by the State House of Assembly on Monday 22nd February, 2021, to full-fledged universities and the fulfillment of other conditions for their recognition, including submission of strategic documents such as the University Law, Strategic Plan, Master Plan, Geophysical survey and Academic Briefs.

The three upgraded institutions

were the College of Education, Agbor, now University of Delta, Agbor; Delta State Polytechnic Ozoro, now Delta State University

the 51st, 52nd and 53rd State universities respectively in Nigeria, the Executive Secretary said that the Commission, as a

of Science and Technology, Ozoro and the Asaba Branch campus of Delta State University, now Dennis Osadebe University, Asaba.

Presenting the letters of recognition of the universities as

matter of Policy, had continued to encourage and support all individuals and Government at all levels, to invest in higher education in order to transform the sector into a veritable engine.

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He described the Governor as a strategic planner and someone very meticulous, which he said was evident in his painstaking approach and adherence to the spirit and letter of the o

While urging the state to specialize in innovative education by providing those cutting-edge programmes that would bring development not only to Delta but Nigeria, he noted that three universities in a day could be misunderstood by undiscerning critics.

He acknowledged that the quest for more universities in Delta was not misplaced as the state was blessed in the area of education endowment with many primary and secondary schools. This, he said, also made it occupied a frontline position in terms of number of students seeking for university education in the map of

According to him, NUC had spent time in the last two years trying to give both institutions the necessary impetus to take-off properly,

challenge of the Maritime University with a bid to enable it start seamlessly without further hitches.

Prof. Rasheed advised the governor to ensure that the new universities satisfied not only the indigenes of the state, but the entire country and beyond so as to maintain the concept of the universality of university education.

Prof. Rasheed said Nigeria have about 99 Private Universities (with the recent approval of 20 new ones), all who are not able to provide more than 7 per cent of available spaces compared to public universities. This, according to him, still posed a great problem of inadequate access to university education. The resultant poverty in the land made it difficult for many families to pay the fees or send their children to private universities,

the Nigerian University System (NUS). He stated that two federal universities had been situated in the state to ameliorate the challenge,

especially the Maritime University. He informed the Governor that the Commission would soon send

arguing that the challenge could be solved with active state government's investment in the sector.

He congratulated the Governor for the fit achieved in establishing the new institution, and acknowledged that his contributions to the development of higher education were laudable.

In his remarks, Dr. Okowa, thanked the NUC Executive Secretary, for the giant stride in repositioning university education in the country, noting that all Delta indigenes and stakeholders welcomed the idea of the conversion of the institutions to full-fledged State universities.

He said the decision became necessary following drastic drop in

the rate of enrolment and demand for courses offered in Colleges of Education and Polytechnics, a

commenced degree programmes in affiliation with Delta State University, Abraka, with the support of NUC.

Governor Okowa said while not undermining the place of

polytechnic education which the state would continue to encourage

He explained that with the absorption of more students in the new universities, the huge resources committed by the state would be better managed in the best interest of Delta's tertiary education system.

Among the rolled out plans in the fund management include the joint utilization of scarce resources for subscription to data bases for e-libraries by the three universities and collaborative researches and production of quality human capital needed for the universities development.

The Governor further stressed that his government decided to upgrade the three institutions after realising that the present Delta State University, Abraka had reached its full carrying capacity with its inability to admit not more than 5,000 students yearly since the year 2018 and that only in 2019, about 25,690 students chose it, but only paltry 4,854 candidates got admission out of 22,450 that were eminently qualified.

decade ago. He stressed that the scenario of students' preference for university degree was more visible in 2007, when the State College of Education, Agbor,

in two other existing campuses, but that resources were being underutilized due to low enrolment.

He said “We are here today, because it is our firm belief that the three state universities will change the face of our educational system, training our graduate to become self-reliant, job creators and not job seekers.

“Adding, it will stem the tide of those qualified candidates rushing to other climes with mushroom universities (such as in Benin Republic) in search of education and paying so much for quality not comparable to those of Nigerian universities.

He disclosed that Delta had over 1, 100 primary schools and 500 public secondary schools, with double this numbers ran by private proprietors of schools. All of them were churning out SSCE graduates yearly, thus increasing the number of admission seekers.

He stated that the upgrade of the three institutions all constituted the same vehicle in the state’s education quadrangle responsible for driving the knowledge economy agenda of Delta Government, especially in Science

providing access, add value to the students, the host Community and the state at large. One of the cardinal charges to the institutions was to provide solutions to the myriad of environmental challenges and degradation suffered in the localities, he added.

He stressed that expanding access to university education for young Nigerians to achieve their aspirations had become a necessity that should attract the

“For us we cannot afford to allow this to continue, in situation where our students continue to receive such sub-standard degrees is unacceptable and certainly counterproductive. NUC ES Visits CAC Registrar

The Executive Secretary, Prof. Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *mmi*, *MFR*, *FNAL* led a delegation of his management team to the pay a courtesy call on the Registrar General of the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) in Abuja last week.

Prof. Rasheed in his speech stated that the visit was to create synergy and cooperation in the activities of the two commissions in the area of registration of Universities. He expressed dismay at the proliferation of illegal Universities in the name of CAC registration.

He said that the commission observed some bottle necks regarding university registration processes which the CAC can assist to resolve. He observed that some limited liability companies registered the name of a university as a profit making venture against NUC procedures. That is making it difficult for NUC to prosecute because it is a legal entity.

He further stated that, any name that has a university nomenclature must be cleared by the NUC before completing its registration with CAC.

He said NUC in collaboration with security agencies such as EFCC, ICPC and Police were tracking and closing down all illegal universities in the country, even though any body can operate a university after satisfying all requirement by the NUC.

He explained that the NUS currently has 173 universities made up of 45 Federal, 49 State and 79 Private, with student population of 5% in private universities while

the federal and state combined made up a total of 95% of student enrolment. All of which are non profit making entities. He expressed appreciation to the Registrar General for receiving them.

The Registrar General of CAC, Alh. Garba Abubakar, in his response said, the issue has been

that, an institution can be registered as an educational organisation/ provider.

He said, according to CAC law, that company can be registered as limited by liability (which is profit making) or limited by guaranty (non profit). He said NUC and CAC can collaborate as it deed with the CBN whereby,

before any financial institution is registered, must obtain a clearance from the CBN.

In the same vein any proprietor willing to establish a university, can preserve the name with the CAC, then obtain clearance from NUC, before it can complete registration

as limited by guaranty.

He promised that CAC database will be cross checked to filter out any university registered as a profit making company, with a view to changing it.

JAMB makes NIN Mandatory for UTME, Direct Entry Admission

Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has said the National Identity Number (NIN) is mandatory for students seeking admission into universities of their choice.

JAMB spokesman Dr Fabian Benjamin, on Wednesday, said all potential candidates must provide their NIN at the point of registration for the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) and Direct Entry (DE) registration.

“This is mandatory for participation in the 2021 registration exercise,” Benjamin said while announcing that JAMB has commenced registration for 2021 exam,” Benjamin said.

“Registration will take place in 700 centres across the country; the list is available in all the state offices of JAMB and on its website at www.jamb.gov.ng.

“The approved schedule for registration and examination are that registration exercise will start on Thursday, April 8 and end on Saturday, May 15, 2021.”

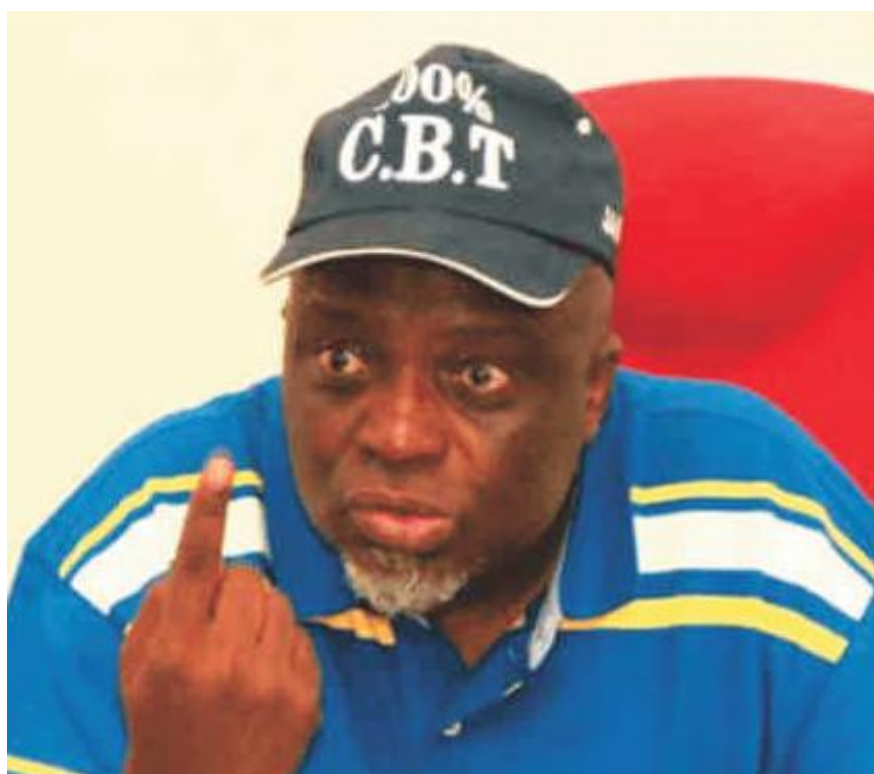

NUC Must Flush Out Corrupt Professors From NUS

Following the recent conviction of a professor for electoral fraud, founder of Afe Babalola University, Ado-Ekiti (ABUAD), Aare Afe Babalola, SAN has called on the National Universities Commission (NUC) to step up and save the nation's education sector from further disrepute.

A professor of soil science at the University of Calabar, Peter Ogban was last week handed three years jail term by Justice Augustine Odokwo of Akwa Ibom High Court for manipulating the results of two local government areas – Oruk Anam and Etim Ekpo during the 2019 senatorial elections.

Babalola who was reacting to the conviction which he described as shameful and embarrassing said NUC should review its law that would make it impossible for convicted academia to secure job in any institutions in the country.

The legal luminary spoke in Ado Ekiti, the Ekiti State capital at the weekend during the events marking the third anniversary of ABUAD's 400-Bed Multi-System Hospital and the send-forth ceremony for the Chief Medical Director of the hospital, Professor Fola Esan.

According to him, the conviction of the professor over electoral fraud was a pointer to the decay in the nation's education sector, said the time had come for the stakeholders especially the NUC to

tackle the disturbing situation.

He said gone were the days when teachers, especially university lecturers and professors were perceived to be above board as well as an embodiment of honesty, transparency and decency.

Babalola said “We have just recently read in the media the shameful story of one Professor Peter Ogban of a university who had just been convicted for electoral fraud that earned him three years imprisonment. But where do we go from here?”

“Since the beginning of this week, we have been celebrating three years of excellence in medicine here and also celebrating our own Professor Esan, the CMD, a man of honour and integrity whose

coming after him would emulate him and strive to improve on his records.

“It is outrightly shameful that while we are busy jubilating and celebrating Professor Esan here, another professor like him is on a prison vacation for electoral fraud.

“I want to use this medium to call on the National Universities Commission to review its laws about the bad eggs in the

university system.

“The moment any academic is convicted of any crime while serving in one university, the NUC should make it impossible for him to be employed in any other university in the country again. This is one of the ways to sanitize the Nigerian university system.”

Babalola said he had no regrets establishing the 400-bed Multi-System Hospital in the institution, which he said was basically for the benefit of Nigerians and humanity in general.

He noted that many medical breakthroughs had been recorded in the hospital within a spate of three years, while the hospital had continually saved many threatened lives and reduced medical tourism abroad.

The Acting Vice-Chancellor, Professor Smaranda Olarinde, said the hospital was currently one of the best around the world and had assumed the position as a leading centre for heart and vascular surgery, “while a wide range of cutting-edge Open-Heart

surgeries and Cardiac interventional procedures had taken place.”

Speaking, the outgoing CMD, Professor Esan expressed gratitude to Babalola for his huge investment in the university and the hospital, saying the popularity enjoyed by the institutions within few years were made possible through his untiring efforts and for providing the enabling environment that made him and others perform optimally.

NOTICE OF ILLEGAL UNIVERSITY OPERATIONS OF AL-NAHDA INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY IN NIGERIA

The attention of the National Universities Commission, NUC, has been drawn to the illegal operation of a so-called Satellite Campus of AL-NAHDA University, Niamey, in Gusau, Zamfara State purportedly awarding undergraduate Degrees to unsuspecting Nigerians.

The illegal AL-NAHDA Satellite, campus is located adjacent to the Zamfara State House of Assembly and has a Polaris Bank Account No. 4091289549, through which payment for its fees in Nigeria are made.

Further investigations by the NUC into the Operation of AL-NAHDA International University revealed that in Niger Republic, the University has campuses in Niamey and Maradi.

The NUC is, by this notice, alerting the general public to the Illegal operations of this institution and wishes to state categorically that all certificates obtained from it will not be recognized or be accepted in Nigeria for the purposes of NYSC, employment and or further studies.

NUC also wishes to advise state, governments

and the private sector to always cross check with the NUC before patronizing any institution purporting to award degrees in any part of Nigeria to avoid embarrassment.

For the avoidance of doubt, AL-NAHDA International University, Niamey, Gusau Satellite Campus is not known to the National Universities Commission which is the sole regulatory agency for all categories of degree awarding institutions in Nigeria and any Cross Border Education model operating in Nigeria.

Their activities violate the Education National Minimum Standards and Establishment of Institutions Act Cap E3 2004, an act which mandates NUC to close down all unapproved degree-awarding institutions.

Consequently, the Proprietors and Promoters of this illegal degree mill are by this notice directed to close down their illegal activities within 30 days. They are also to give the National Universities Commission notice of compliance within the stated period or be ready to face the consequences of their illegal operations.

TERMS OF REFERENCE (ToR)

TOR 1: Examine the relationship between the institution and the various statutory bodies it interacts with, according to its law, for the purposes of supervision, planning, finance, discipline, guidance etc. Such bodies include the Governing Council, the supervising Agency and the Federal Ministry of Education as well as the Visitor

TOR 2: Examine the quality of the leadership of the institution in terms of the role of the Governing Council, the Head of institution and other Principal Officers

TOR 3: Examine the financial management of the institution over the recommended period and determine whether it was in compliance with appropriate regulations

TOR 4: Investigate the application of funds, particularly the special grants and loans meant for particular projects, in order to determine the status of such projects and their relevance for further funding.

TOR 5: Examine all academic programmes, policies and practices as well as the total academic and physical development, performance and direction of the institution and advise as to whether the desired targets have been met and how modifications may be made to achieve maximum academic productivity, excellence and service to the nation.

TOR 6: Study the general atmosphere of the institution over the period in question. In particular the general conduct and comportment of all personnel of the institution especially staff, students and managers and advice as to whether the correct training is being given and how necessary corrections may be made. This should include the relationship between the institution and the host community over the period.

TOR 7: Study in detail the management structure and performance of the institution including fiscal, administrative, personnel and welfare policies and advise on ways to cut costs, reduce waste and continue to develop, if necessary by adaptation, rather than expansion in the face of attenuated resources.

TOR 8: Examine the Law establishing the institution and consider in what ways the law has been observed in all ramifications by the competent authorities and suggest any necessary modifications to the law in order to enable the institution achieve its objectives better.

TOR 9: Advise on any and all other aspects of the institution that you may consider should be of interest to both the Visitor and the public; and to the attainment of the objectives for which the institution was set up


RE: SECOND WAVE OF COVID-19: STAY-AT-HOME DIRECTIVE TO GL 12 OFFICERS AND BELOW

I write at the behest of the Executive Secretary to inform the Vice-Chancellors of all Nigerian Universities, that the Federal Government has, vide the attached Circular HCSF/3065/Vol.1/47 and dated 22nd December, 2020, issued by the Office of the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation, directed that Officers on Grade Level 12 and below should stay at home for a period of five weeks, effective from Wednesday, 23rd December, 2020.

Vice-Chancellors are to please note that the directive is part of the measures approved by Mr. President to mitigate the second wave of Coronavirus (COVID-19) infections in the country. The affected Officers are expected to perform their duties from home while those on GL 13 and above should strictly adhere to the extant preventive measures including maintenance of physical distancing, regular washing of hands and/or sanitizing of hands, wearing of face masks and reducing the number of visitors to offices. A copy of the Circular is attached for proper guidance and for Vice-Chancellors to ensure full compliance with the directives of the Federal Government, as appropriate.

I am to add that, in line with the directives of the Presidential Task Force (PTF) on COVID-19 on Monday, 21st December, 2020, all academic activities, involving large crowds (e.g. classrooms, hostel accommodation, conferences and seminars), should be suspended whilst the Universities remain closed during this intervening period, pending further directives by the Federal Government on the reopening of schools.



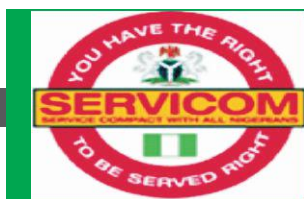
