# FG Says 1.12trn Required to Foot Proposed ASUU, Varsity Workers Wage Increase

The Federal Government has said the proposal made by the Prof. Nimi Briggs-led Committee in relation to the demands by members of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) and other unions in universities would gulp N1.12 trillion to implement.

Although the Minister of Labour and Employment, Senator Chris Ngige has rose in stout defence of Government that there is currently no Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) between it and the union awaiting signing by President Muhammadu Buhari.

Dr. Ngige in a statement signed by the Deputy Director Press and Public Relations in the Labour Ministry, Mr. Olajide Oshundun, rather said, having rounded off its works, the Prof. Briggs Committee had proposed 109-185 per cent increase in the university wage structure.

It explained that based on the

recommendation, Federal Government would incur, an additional N560 billion as salaries alone, on top of the

present N412 billion, less all other allowances such as Earned Allowance, field trip responsibility and postgraduate supervision allowances, and hazard allowances which were to gulp another N170 billion."

that ASUU insisted that relevant Ministries and Agencies should recuse themselves from the sitting of the Committee, accusing them of noncooperation.

The statement added: "In all, the sum of N1.12trn will be needed to pay the salaries and allowances of university lecturers and other staff in the university system."

The Minister of Labour and Employment claimed that at present, the wage bill of the university staff and their colleagues in teaching health systems gulp nearly 50 per cent of the total federal government staff personnel cost/ wages.

"Recall too that the Staff of Polytechnics and Colleges of Education has also placed their wage review in the front burner since two weeks ago," he said.

While explaining how the Prof. Briggs Committee reached the proposed wage increase, Senator Ngige said what happened was

"All alone with the Prof. Briggs Committee, ASUU started fixing their salaries and allowances to the exclusion of the statutory government ministries and agencies that manage the entire annual finances of government, budget and fiscal policies and the Office of the Head of Service that is in charge of ensuring that public service rules and regulations are not undermined in any condition of service offered to public officers in the universities.

"Because of this exclusion engineered by ASUU, and the arising complaints to the Chief of Staff to the President and the Minister of Labour and Employment by the concerned MDAs, the Chief of Staff and the Minister of Labour set up an Inter-Ministerial/Agency subcommittee comprising the affected MDAs under the Minister of State Budget and National Planning to quickly look into Prof. Briggs Committee report which to all intents and purpose was still a proposal in June 2022 at the government side meeting.

"This assignment was to be completed with the Presidential Committee on Salaries and Wages and given two weeks to come up with their recommendation," he said.

Dr. Ngige said based on the foregoing, no agreement had been reached between the Federal Government, ASUU and other university unions on the renegotiation of their salaries and allowances (wages).

The Minister, however, said, the

Presidential Committee on Salaries and Wages has finished the review of the Prof. Nimi Briggs proposal and would shortly submit same to the President.

"This clears every doubt that there is an agreement before the President waiting for his signature. There is none," he said.

The Hon. Minister further said any CBA produced between the unions and the federal government would not be signed by the President, but by the government negotiating team and MDAs led by the direct employer with the conciliating ministry witnessing.

"This clarification has become necessary in view of the deluge of deliberate misinformation being dished out to Nigerians by the President of ASUU, Prof Emmanuel Osodeke as well as his branch leaders, calling on President Muhammadu Buhari to sign an agreement which they claimed to have reached with the federal government", he said.

"We wish therefore to inform Nigerians that there is no such CBA that has been reached between the federal government, ASUU and other university unions on the renegotiation of their salaries and allowances (wages). What is in existence is a proposal," Dr. Ngige stated.

# **TETFUND Tasks VCs to Address National Development Challenges**

The Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) has called on Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian Universities to ensure the optimal operation of the Centre of Excellence created in their universities so as to address some specific developmental challenges in Nigeria.

It would be recalled that the Board of the TETFund had in November 2020 approved N12 billion to the University of Lagos (UNILAG), University of Abuja (UNIABUJA) and 10 Others, as the pioneer Centres of Excellence."

The motives behind the Centres of Excellence were to address some specific national development challenges through the preparation of professionals, applied research and associated outreach activities to partners, especially community services.

Two centres were established in each of the six-geo-political zones. In the North-Central, UNIABUJA and University of Jos (UNIJOS) were selected as Centres of Excellence in Public Governance and Leadership and Food Security respectively, while in North East, the Abubakar Tafewa Balewa University (ATBU), Bauchi, is also the Centre of Excellence in Food Security, while the University of Maiduguri (UNIMAID) had the Centre of Excellence in Arid Zone Research and

Development.

The North-west had the Usman

Dan Fodio University, Sokoto (UDUS) as a Centre of Excellence in Urology and Nephrology and Bayero University, Kano (BUK) in Renewable Energy.

South-East had the Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike (MOUAU) and Nnamdi Azikiwe University (NAU), Awka, as the Centre of Excellence in Root Crop Research, Development and Agriculture Transitional Studies, respectively.

In the South-South, the University of Benin (UNIBEN) and University of Uyo (UNIUYO) got Centres of Excellence in Aquaculture and Food Technology and Computational Intelligence and Multi-Disciplinary Studies, respectively.

While also in the South-west, the University of Ibadan (UNIBADAN) and the University of Lagos (UNILAG) were responsible for Biodiversity Conservation and Ecosystem Management.

In his Speech at the Vice-Chancellors Roundtable Meeting

on the implementation of the Agricultural Research and Innovation Fellowship for Africa (ARIFA) in Nigeria, with the theme: Building The Post-Vicosa Symposium Action Plan, the Executive Secretary of TETFund, Architect Sonny Echono stressed the importance of agriculture in addressing unemployment in Nigeria.

He urged the Vice-Chancellors to deploy more energy into the actualisation of Agriculture transformation, while he enjoined them to operationalise the centres of excellence as soon as possible.

"My charge to you is to make this a personal mission. I am very confident that if we get it right in the aspect of agriculture as a country, half of our problems are solved because it is the easiest means of creating jobs," he said.

He charged them to find modern ways of doing the things that could significantly improve revenue generation.

"Moreso, if we are able to adopt new technology, develop our mechanisation and irrigation, we will find opportunities

through commercial agriculture and we will also be able to absorb the graduates who will do the production.

"More than 60 percent of those who graduated in agriculture go on to do other things with their lives simply because we don't have the commercial farming that can absorb this workforce that we have produced," Architect Echono said.

He stated that Nigeria could learn a lot from Brazil through partnership, given that country's track record in agriculture.

# Stakeholders Urge African Varsities to Embrace **EE Post Covid-19**


The Vice-Chancellor of Bingham University, Karu, Nasarawa State, Prof. William Ourix, has urged African Universities to embrace Entrepreneurship Education (EE) as means to adapt Forum for Innovation in African Universities hosted by the Centre for African Entrepreneurship and Leadership (CAEL) University of Wolverhampton recently.

In his speech at the event, former Executive Secretary of NUC, Prof. Peter Okebukola, OFR, who examined the state of education in Africa Pre and Post Covid-19. noted that African universities were doing well but required more efforts in adapting to post Covid-19 challenges.

Prof. Okebukola urged African universities to embrace technology and deploy it appropriately to education.

In his remarks, the Director of the Centre for African Entrepreneurship and Leadership, Dr. Paschal Anosike

acknowledged the successes recorded by the Centre which include the inauguration of the

Forum.

The Forum, which was declared opened by a former Commissioner of Science Education, African Union, Prof. Sarah Agang, received the Mayor of Wolverhampton, Her Right Worshipful, Councillor Sandra Samuels, OBE, who later hosted participants to an invite-only Mayoral luncheon.

## 150 Nigerian Varsity Students to Get Grooming Centre's **N20m Research Grants**

Grooming Centre, which runs as a Microfinance Institution is set to give out a total sum of N20 million as Research Grants to 100 undergraduate and 50 postgraduate final year students in any of the public and private universities in the country.

The grants, with this year's edition and fourth in the series, are to support the research projects of the intended beneficiaries.

Head of Project, Grooming Centre Nigeria, Mr. Egulefu Chikezie, made this disclosure at a news conference to officially announce the commencement of submission of entries for this year's edition of the grants at the Corporate Headquarters of the organisation in Lagos, last week.

He said the grants were part of the social intervention efforts of the bank on education to encourage and boost evidence-based research works among university students in areas such as microfinance, rural development, inclusive finance, social

enterprise, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), technological development, women in development and any other areas aimed at lifting people out of poverty.

He said the bank believes that

so many university student in the country would want to carry out research works on problems-solving issues that are impactful to the economy; hence the giving of grant awards to assist them.

Mr. Chikezie said that each of the 50 postgraduate potential beneficiaries who could come from any part of the country and without any religious beliefs, consideration or family financial status, would get a sum of N200, 000 and their undergraduate counterparts N100, 000 each.

He said submission of entries which would be done strictly online through a dedicated portal had begun on June 18 and will last till September 30, after which successful applicants will receive their grants.

Giving more insight into the scheme, the Chief Operating Officer, CREM, which manages the grants, Mr. Clifford Oneike, said "aside from the fact that the research works must show a high level of originality and convincing target results and be data-driven, applicants must have to, among others submit their research proposals of about 10 to 15 pages and a written recommendation from their project supervisors.
