I therefore urge you to turn in a timely, credibly and reliable report of the activities, programmes and projects of your departments and organisations. "Worthy of note is the fact that this exercise will enhance decision making and policy formulation as the data collected and collated will aid evidencebased planning, measure implementation and progress and identify areas where improvement is required.

"As officers in the education sector, I do not need to overemphasize the pertinent role education plays in the overall development of our nation. You must know that all other sectors are dependent on the education sector for their successes. T h e r e f o r e, w e m u s t passionately, and patriotically salvage our country, Nigeria," he added.

The Minister explained that the Federal Government of Nigeria would soon sign a partnership contract with an ICT firm to generate data on all schools in Nigeria in order to tackle challenges in the sector. In his words: "It is our plan that by the end of this year or early next year, we will be signing a partnership contract with a firm that will be working with our IT people to generate data on all schools in Nigeria".

He stressed it was necessary because the Ministry need to know its teachers and every single students as well as their data in order to know the trend of learning and available infrastructure.

Explaining further, Professor Mamman said the exercise would enhance decision making and policy formulation as the data collected and collated would aid evidence-based planning, measure implementation and progress and identify areas where improvement was required.

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# Afreximbank Gives AUN \$100,000 Grant for Agric Dev't

he American University of Nigeria (AUN) Yola in Adamawa State has received the sum of \$100,000 as grant from the African Export-Import Bank (AfreximBank) to support agriculture information project for rural farmers in the state.

The programme was aimed at covering 60 per cent of the 40 million farmers with mobile devices in Nigeria by the end of 2024.

The funds targeted at supporting the university's Agricultural Yawo Uniform Information and Access to Market System (A-YUNIAMS) project, also sought to provide seamless information on farming techniques, financial opportunities, market prices of products and weather information to rural farmers through a mobile solution.

The A-YUNIAMS project, being implemented by AUN's School of Engineering, ASBA Synergy and InnoInspire Ltd, was projected to start in Adamawa State in the North East of Nigeria before scaling to other parts of the country later in the year.

In a letter conveying the offer to AUN, Afreximbank's Director in charge of African Union, African Continental Free Trade Agreement Relations and Trade Policy, Mr. Yusuf Daya said that the Bank that the mobile solution would help bridge the information gap faced by rural farmers on modern and more resilient crop varieties and efficient farming

recognized t h e "transformative potential of the A-YUNIAMS project and the impact it could have on the lives of rural farmers.

Mr. Daya noted that such potential included providing farmers with information on modern, more resilient crop varieties, efficient farming techniques, funding opportunities and market prices that would empower them to improve their overall capacity and crop yield, and ensure more sustainable and profitable living.

The Director further noted

He added that it would also build capacity to improve productivity of rural farmers, help support growth and expansion of local industries that could feed into the economic diversification.

The Project Manager, Dr. Abubakar Sadiq Hussaini, himself, a specialist in Electrical-Electronic and Telecommunications Engineering and Dean of the School of Engineering at AUN, described the A-YUNIAMS

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project as a powerful tool, from farm to market, at the fingertips of farmers.

He said that the project would bridge the information gap faced by farmers.

According to him, "the application will provide farmers with a comprehensive suite of tools, from efficient farming techniques and real-time weather updates to invaluable market insights, empowering them to make informed decisions and to maximize their yields."

Dr. Hussaini lauded the President of the bank, Prof. Benedict Oramah, and to his team, for the financial support and pledged the project's dedication to improving the well-being of rural farmers.

AUN's President, Dr. DeWayne Frazier, also commended Afreximbank's contribution to the University, noting that it would make a meaningful difference.

"This gift from Afreximbank is not only timely but also very generous," Dr Frazier said.

It should be noted that Afreximbank has been a Pan-African multilateral financial institution mandated to finance and promote intra-and extra-

African trade.

For 30 years, the Bank has been deploying innovative structures to deliver financing solutions that support the transformation of the structure of Africa's trade, accelerating industrialization and intra-regional trade, thereby boosting economic expansion in Africa.

A stalwart supporter of the African Continental Free Trade Agreement (AfCFTA), Afreximbank has launched a Pan-African Payment and Settlement System (PAPSS)

# **Prof. Obafemi Advocates More Funding for Public Varsities**

renowned University Don and Pro-Chancellor and Chairman, Governing Council, Federal University of Technology (FUT), Minna, Professor Olu Obafemi, has called on the Federal Government to adequately fund public universities in the country.

Professor Obafemi, a renowned Poet, made the call while delivering a Public Lecture organised by the University of Jos (UniJOS) Chapter of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU) in Jos.

The public lecture had the theme "Government's Commitment to Funding Public Universities in Nigeria: The Past the Present and Future".

The don, who said that the current budgetary allocation for education in the country was grossly inadequate, insisted that proper funding would prevent Nigerians from moving to other countries in search of university degrees.

"According to UNESCO standard, budgetary allocation for education should be 26 per cent, but over the years, our budget for education has never gone beyond eight per cent. In fact, the 2024 budget for education is seven per cent.

"Over 70 per cent of the crisis within the university education is caused by poor funding and

mismanagement of resources and the struggle to make government to right the wrongs has been the reason for the incessant strikes, particularly by ASUU.

remember fallen colleagues, particularly those who died for the cause of the union.

The National President, who commended the federal

"Poor funding is a major impediment toward the growth of public universities and this is why Nigerians send their children to Europe or poorer African countries to acquire university degrees," he said.

Earlier, the National President of ASUU, Professor Emmanuel Osadeke, had commended the chapter for organising the public lecture to mark its 2024 Heroes Day.

Professor Osadeke explained that the day was set aside to government for excluding universities from the Treasury Single Account (TSA), however, said that more was needed to be done to better the lots of public universities and education in general.

"We have been struggling for years, but nothing has changed. Lecturers do not need palliative from government but proper funding that will guarantee good welfare packages for them.

"Today, a university professor in Nigeria earn less than \$200 dollars while a lecturer takes less

than \$50 dollars," he lamented.

On his part, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Jos, Professor Tanko Ishaya, promised to support the struggle by ASUU toward tackling the challenges facing public universities in the country. "If not for ASUU, public universities would have been grounded just like public primary and secondary education.

"So, government must ensure absolute autonomy for the university system; that will enable managers of these institutions run them effectively," he said

The occasion was chaired by a one-time Vice-Chancellor of the University of Jos, Professor Monday Mwangvwat.

The event was attended by Academics from different universities across the country.

## **Ekiti Varsity Don Canvases Funding for Anatomical Science**

Senior Lecturer at the Department of Anatomy at Ekiti State University Ado-Ekiti (EKSU), Dr. Adebanji Akingbade has called on government at all levels to commit more funds to the basic science courses especially anatomy in the interest of society.

Dr. Akingbade explained that provision of funding would help in carrying out more research with sophisticated equipment and facilities to advance the course of humanity, saying, "Anatomy is the father of medicine".

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He spoke during the Academic Seminar organized by the Anatomical Students Society of Nigeria (ASSON) EKSU chapter with the topic, "Collaborative Research in Anatomy: Building Partnerships Between Nigerian Institutions and International Organisations."

The seminar's topic was delivered by an Associate Professor of Anatomy from the Osun State University, Dr. Adekomi Damilare.

Dr. Akingbade, who is the immediate past Head of Department noted that with the right funding in the universities system for anatomy, humanity would be better for it with more innovations and discoveries, adding that the place of anatomical science in the society could hardly be overemphasised.

He commended the state governor, Chief Biodun Oyebanji for his recent increase in subvention to EKSU, which he said would assist the institution to meet its obligations, urging the governor to provide more funding for the university system.

According to him, "We want government to come to the aid of anatomical sciences, with funding we can do better. Government should fund basic science courses especially anatomy so that we would be able to have access to state-of-the-art facilities because most of the research we want to do is at the sub-cellular level.

"We have issues carrying out these experiments because we don't have the equipment around, for example, we don't have an electro-microscope or confocal microscope in this part of the country, maybe in one or two universities in Nigeria.

"So, with funding and government intervention, we can do more in anatomy and if you don't have access to these state-of-the-art equipment, we can't discover new things."

Reiterating the need for the passage and signing into law of the Anatomy Bill, he said, "This is why we are trying to reactivate anatomy bill.

Without signing Anatomy Act into law, society can't enjoy the impact of anatomy. The bill has passed through the first and second reading in the House of Representatives. We are just expecting the final assertions of the President so that we can practice anatomy fully. "Just a layman won't have access to our bodies. It will be qualified anatomy that will have access to our bodies; our research will be defined. We have different research we carry out in anatomy.

Anatomy is a key course in basic science and reasons why people say that anatomy is the father of medicine."

Delivering his lecture, Dr Adekomi explained that the field of anatomy has moved beyond the tradition of studying only the structures of the body but to other areas in human endeavour.

While stressing the need for collaboration in research, the lecturer maintained that anatomy now became relevant in different areas especially challenges confronting people in society.

He advised the students to be more dedicated and committed to their studies as this field of study they have chosen for themselves has the power to unlock the myriad of health issues in the human race.

Speaking, the President of ASSON, EKSU, Chapter, Mr. Adeniyi Adetunji said the event was organized as part of the annual week of the anatomy students, to sensitize the students on the prospects of anatomy education in the country.

## **CALL FOR MEMORANDA FROM THE PUBLIC**

1. Following the recent publication of allegations of certificate racketeering involving some foreign institutions, especially in Cotonou, Benin Republic and other countries, the Federal Ministry of Education has constituted an Inter-Ministerial Committee to investigate the allegations with a view to providing lasting solutions to the problem. The Committee was inaugurated by the Honourable Minister of Education on Tuesday, 9<sup>th</sup> January, 2024 with the following Terms of Reference:

- I. Examine the veracity of the allegations of degree certificate racketeering within both foreign and local private universities in Nigeria;
- ii. Review the role of any MDA or its officials (including identifying such officials) in the facilitation of the recognition and procurement of the fake certificate in question;
- iii. Review existing policies and procedures related to accreditation and certification to identify weaknesses contributing to the issue;
- iv. Examine the rules, procedures and processes for recognition and accreditation of foreign universities and programmes by the Federal Ministry of Education;
- v. Establish if unapproved foreign institutions (Degree Mills) exist or not in Nigeria in whatever form with their identities and locations if any;
- vi. Make appropriate recommendations for review of any rules, procedures, and processes to prevent re-occurrence and sanctions for identified erring officials;
- vii. Make other recommendations that will strengthen the system of recognition, accreditations and quality assurance of degrees in Nigeria;
- viii. Examine the extant rules, procedures and processes for granting provisional licenses to new universities by the National Universities Commission (NUC);
- ix. Examine the procedures and processes for periodic accreditation of programmes in the universities by NUC and examine their effectiveness in quality assurance of the programmes;
- x. Without prejudice to the periodic accreditation exercise of the NUC, examine whether or not Private Universities established in the last 15 years have in place prescribed facilities, appropriate management structure, adequate funding of programmes, requisite staff (nature of staff-full-time, contract, adjunct, visiting, other types).

2. Memoranda from the general public are, therefore, solicited to provide information to the Committee to help it make appropriate recommendations to address the menace in line with its Terms of Reference and any other information that will be useful to the Committee. ### RE: ABOUT 100 FAKE PROFESSORS JUST UNCOVERED IN NIGERIAN UNIVERSITIES – NUC A REBUTTAL

The attention of the National Universities Commission (NUC) has been drawn to news items, circulating on the social media, some national dailies and television stations, to the effect that the Commission has just "discovered over 100 fake Professors in Nigerian Universities". The NUC wishes to deny these media reports categorically and unequivocally. They are fake, untrue and a figment of the imagination of the author(s), all happening at an unsuitable time, when the nation is awaiting the outcome of the investigation into the fake certificate saga from universities in some neighbouring countries. The Commission therefore finds this development as unfair to all stakeholders.

Specifically, the fake news items have been circulating in two forms – (i) as a link to a 2019 online news item; and (ii) as a separate list of names of the alleged fake Professors in various Nigerian Universities, which was not the case. We consider these unfounded publications as ill-conceived and a ploy by unscrupulous persons to create in plausible a tone, disquiet, panic and provoking outcries at both the national and international levels.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Commission can confirm that it initiated in 2019 a laudable project, with the intent of compiling and publishing a list of full Professors in the Nigerian Universities System (NUS) through the use of an online portal to collate the requisite data. During the exercise, the NUC found anomalies, such as Associate Professors being listed as full Professors. It is essential to also state clearly that the Commission as a responsible Federal Government Agency, does not engage in half-baked exercises capable of tarnishing the image of Nigeria and the NUS. That was why the Commission deemed it necessary to share the collated data with the Nigerian Universities for the purpose of authentication by the competent authourities as to who qualifies to be a full professor. Based on the verified data, the Commission then in a landmark accomplishment, first published the list of full Professors who participated in the exercise in 2019. It was understood that this

would be succeeded by a continuous process of updating the list of full Professors. It is important to state at this point that all the issues pertaining to the 2019 verification of full Professors in Nigerian Universities were concluded in 2019. Since then, the Commission has entrenched a more reliable system of generating the list of full Professors in the NUS. The Commission is also conscious of the fact that some of the academics not captured in the 2019 exercise may now have matured and progressed to become full Professors; this being the reason why it continuously updates the list of full Professors in the NUS.

The National Universities Commission questions the rationale behind recycling this stale 2019 news of an activity it initiated, conducted and laid to rest in the same year. The purpose and objective of resurrecting in 2024 (more than 4 years later) this-no-longer-fresh news, is clearly intended to generate unnecessary controversy at an unsuitable time, whilst lacing it with a false list of fake Professors.

The National Universities Commission owes it a solemn duty to protect and guard the integrity of the many hardworking and committed academics in the NUS, who have earned national and international respect and recognition. Therefore, the Commission has been saddled with the vital and strategic responsibility by its enabling laws, to uphold the sanctity of quality in all aspects of our University Education delivery.

The Commission wishes to use this medium to advise Government officials at all levels, members of the NUS, the international community, and the public, to please disregard these items of fake and stale news which have long been laid to rest in 2019. ### Press Release SUSPENSION OF EVALUATION AND ACCREDITATION OF DEGREE CERTIFICATES FROM THE BENIN AND TOGO REPUBLICS.

The attention of the Federal Ministry of Education has been drawn to the commendable work of investigative journalism that led to the publication by the Daily Nigerian Newspaper dated 30<sup>th</sup> December 2023 titled "UNDERCOVER: How DAILY NIGERIAN reporter bagged Cotonou varsity degree in 6 weeks, participated in NYSC scheme". This was also carried in various social media.

 This report lends credence to suspicions that some Nigerians deploy nefarious means and unconscionable methods to get a Degree with the end objective of getting graduate job opportunities for which they are not qualified.

3. The Federal Ministry of Education vehemently decries such acts and with effect from 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2024 is suspending evaluation and accreditation of degree certificates from Benin and Togo Republics pending the outcome of an investigation that would involve the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Nigeria and the two countries, the ministries responsible for Education in the two countries as well the Department of State Security Services (DSSS), and the National Youths Service Corps (NYSC). The Ministry therefore wish to call on the General Public to support its efforts, show understanding and provide useful information that will assist the Committee in finding lasting solutions in order to prevent further occurrence.

 The Ministry has also commenced internal administrative processes to determine the culpability or otherwise of her staff for which applicable Public Service Rules would be applied. 5. The issue of degree mills institutions, i.e institutions that exist on paper or operate in dandestine manner outside the control of regulators is a global problem that all countries grapple with. FME has been contending with the problem including illegal institutions located abroad or at home preying on unsuspecting, innocent Nigerians and some desperate Nigerians who deliberately patronize such outlets. Periodically, warnings have been issued by the Ministry and NUC against the resort to such institutions and in some instances, reports made to security agencies to clamp down on the perpetrators. The ministry will continue to review its strategy to plug any loopholes, processes and procedures and deal decisively with any conniving officials.

6. The Ministry had always adopted the global standard for evaluation and accreditation of certificates of all forms which relies on receipt of the list of accredited courses and schools in all countries of the World.

7. The Ministry wishes to assure Nigerians and the general public that, it is already putting in place mechanisms to sanitise the education sector, including dissuading the quest for degree certificates (locally or from foreign countries) through a re-invigorated focus on inclusivity: reliance on all skill sets as directed by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu GCFR.

8. The Federal Ministry of Education is committed to collaborating with stakeholders, including civil society organizations, to consistently enhance the Nigerian education system and we value the public's understanding and patience as we strive to address these issues.

9. The Federal Ministry of Education wishes all Nigerians a happy new year. A year in which we would all work together to strengthen our education sector.
